Harvest Home Celebrating 41 Years!

arvest Home opened in 1979, giving the greater Akron area its first shelter for homeless women including mothers with children. During its first year, 20,096 meals were served, 5,446 nights of lodging provided, and at least 300 individuals were assisted. Women received the help they needed for a better future, by overcoming life altering problems like physical/ emotional abuse and economic hardship to alcohol and drug addiction. The discipleship programs and the love and care from the Harvest Home staff helped to transform the lives of many women and enabled them to be freed from the problems that left them homeless and jobless. Daily life application Bible studies, work assignments, and living skills classes were implemented as well as care, counseling, and activities for the children.

This laid the foundation for what the Harvest Home is today. During its 41st year, over 70,000 meals were served, 20,959 nights of lodging, and at least 718 individuals were assisted as well as clothing distributed to 425 women and children. At Harvest Home's Nurture Center, our Child Advocate and Assistant Child Advocate work tirelessly with the children as they build relationships, teach the Gospel, and mentor as needed. Children who have been traumatized and set up for failure, have the opportunity to thrive in a stable and caring environment while they enjoy playing with many toys, reading books, and using the learning tools. Harvest Home works on giving everyone they serve a hope and a future.

Recently, we had five children commit their lives to Christ. I praise the Lord for this because it confirms how important it is for our staff to minister to the emotional, physical, and spiritual needs of the children each day.

I thank the Lord that over 41 years ago, before Harvest Home was built, Rev. Thomas and Eileen Thomas recognized the need for a shelter for women and women with children. Through much prayer God made it possible. As we celebrate God's faithfulness and provision, we are thankful He is still changing and transforming the lives of women and children.

Also, to help women get back on their feet, additional programs were added over time including computerenhanced instruction in math, reading, and verbal communication. *Future Story*, a social enterprise and job training program, has provided services and training in job and life skills classes, which has included their former gardening program and current sewing programs. *Future Story* also provides for women to attend the State Tested Nurse's Aide program at Stark State. Hope offered with a Christ-centered focus allows these women to begin the process of building a new *Future Story*.
