Dear Friends:

As we reflect on the past year, there is much to be thankful for as God's grace, strength, wisdom, and love carried us through this difficult year. In January and February of 2020, the renovation of the long term discipleship program was completed. In this renovation, we doubled the program's size from 18 beds to 36 beds for men wanting Christ-centered programming.

As we entered into March, COVID-19 changed the direction of how many businesses and organizations would operate. As a shelter-in mandate was ordered by the state, this caused many businesses to close during this time, with only essential businesses remaining open. With Haven of Rest being essential, we remained open 7 days a week, 24 hours a day. Many safety precautions were put in place such as face masks, sanitizing stations, plexi-glass at all of our counters, and continuing to educate our guests on the importance of sanitizing and social distancing.

Our regional banquets were all cancelled except for one which was held at the beginning of March. We have missed seeing our friends at these special events. Curt Thomas III, who is a third generation Thomas serving at the Mission for 30 years, was diagnosed with cancer. He is unable to work at the Mission and is going through an aggressive chemotherapy treatment. Not only has Curt been a faithful servant to the Lord, but he has been a great friend to all of us. His wife Tina, daughter Julia, who has special needs, and Curt all need our prayers.

To all of our friends out there, thank you from the bottom of our hearts for how you have supported us through 2020. Through prayer, clothing donations, food donations, and financial gifts you have carried us through and have blessed and encouraged us greatly. As we enter into 2021, I want you to know that we are praying for you. As we walk together in this New Year, I would like to offer a Scripture to encourage you. John 14:27 says, "Peace I leave with you, my peace I give unto you: not as the world giveth, give I unto you. Let not your heart be troubled, neither let it be afraid."

MEN'S RESIDENTIAL PROGRAM

In the late 80's, the Men's Residential Program was established out of the need to help men who were broken, poverty stricken, and struggling with homelessness and addictions. Haven of Rest wanted to meet more than just the needs for food, shelter, and clothing, and decided to expand its services by offering classes that included discipleship, education, and career development. These programs helped men achieve sustainability in overcoming their difficulties. Today, as the Mission continues to grow and provide for the changing needs of Resident Men, the Gospel of Salvation remains the same.

Homelessness can happen for many reasons, including but not limited to, a lack of jobs with livable wages, lack of affordable housing, medical challenges and handicaps, insufficient support for mental health and substance abuse, and domestic violence. There has been an increase in the number of people experiencing these situations during the COVID-19 pandemic.

At Haven of Rest Ministries, we believe in a holistic approach to ending and preventing homelessness and poverty, including:

- Emergency Shelter and access to Residential and Transitional Housing, and Permanent Supportive Housing
- Opportunities for education, career development, job and life skills, resume building, business exploration, increasing income and building a savings, job training, internships, workshops, and more.
- Affordable and accessible healthcare
- A coordinated, collaborative approach to crisis
 response for our clientele, both in-house and through
 partnering with local agencies, schools, colleges,
 businesses, churches, and community organizations
 in addition to the services and programs provided
 in-house.

The Mission seeks to meet the needs of our clientele in a safe, caring, and spiritual environment with the support from you and all of our volunteers, partnerships within the community, and collective efforts from individuals and staff members. Here, men have the opportunity to rebuild their lives. Families are reunited, education is continued or completed, employment and housing is found, as well as other goals made and obtained. Healing and deliverance from drugs, alcohol, and other addictions are made

possible. As men apply themselves and complete courses, it is rewarding to see them find fulfillment and a new life.

Haven of Rest was founded 77 years ago by Curt's grandparents, Rev. Charles C. and Marjorie Ruth Thomas, where Curt spent many hours growing up at Haven of Rest. After a couple years of piano lessons, he and his sister took turns playing hymns for

the evening service at the Mission. Eileen recollects, "We were there every Wednesday, Saturday, and Sunday night for the service. Curt was a good helper for me in cleaning shelves and things in the Mission kitchen when it was necessary. The apron that I put on him was almost bigger than he was!!"

Curt graduated from Kent State University with a Bachelor of Arts in Human Resource Management and then with a Master of Science in Counseling from Cairn University, (previously Philadelphia College of the Bible). He has served at Haven of Rest Ministries for the past 30 years where he met his wife Tina, who was also on staff. They share a deep faith and servant's heart of love and



compassion. They have been married for 23 years and have a beautiful daughter Julia, who loves music and plays the keyboard.
