#### WOMEN'S DAY ROOM

The **Women's Day Room** was opened in 1995 as a part of the Client Service Center to serve as the entry point for women to begin the rehabilitation process that leads to the stabilization and reestablishment of their lives. Myra Schneider was the first Client Services Manager followed by Kathleen Turner. At present, Kristin Witherow serves in this position. These ladies have led the way in providing a safe, clean space for homeless single women.

Haven of Rest is presently updating the *Women's Day Room* with new furniture purchased through a generous grant. Additional supplies were donated from Lowe's Home Improvement store. Fresh paint and décor will furnish a new look.

Women's immediate needs are addressed and efforts are put forth to help them resume meaningful, productive lives. Bible study, developmental and educational programs, counseling, discipleship, employment assistance, drug



recovery classes, and agency referrals are just a few of the services provided. Other essential services include laundry, showers, telephone, and mail pickup.

There are several ways the Mission's programs and services helped Jlynn address her original challenges. Chapel services, Bible Studies, Discipleship, and Daily Devotions helped her form a solid relationship with God. Jlynn shares, "I nurtured a better relationship with God, family, and myself. I was able to listen to the Word several times a day and learned how I needed to remember God throughout the day. I made amends with my family and got in touch with myself."

The drug and alcohol classes facilitated by Isobel Faltisco, Harvest Home Case Manager, benefited Jlynn as she says, *"It helped me continue my sobriety and coping skills when I started feeling that I wanted to go back to bad habits."* Jlynn shared with excitement how she was also able to complete the Future Story sewing class and earn a new sewing machine.

Today, Jlynn continues to grow as she stays connected to the Mission. She has been living on her own for over a year



now. At present, she volunteers for the Future Story sewing class, teaching other women how to sew. Peace is evident over Jlynn as she talks about how she feels protected, has found stability in Summit County, loves the relationships she cultivated, and has grown within the community.

She would like to share the following to Haven of Rest Ministry supporters, "*Thank you for your love and compassion. You made a great impact in my life.*" She adds that she is grateful for Haven of Rest and its founders.

# HELP ALONG THE WAY

Because of the Lord, Haven of Rest, and Eileen Thomas, former director of Harvest Home, Wynette Carmichael was able to change her life. She still goes to AA meetings to this day and helps many others find sobriety. *"I* have been able to make many friends and try to help where I can," shares Wynette, a former resident at Harvest Home in 1995. Tired of being homeless and addicted to drugs, she came when she was age 32.

Wynette's mom passed away when she was two, and her dad was never seen sober. He would go to work, come home, and pass out while his sister did her best to raise Wynette and her siblings. When Wynette was 17, she was introduced to marijuana and alcohol. When she was 19, her father died from alcoholism. Wynette continued her addictions and eventually lost custody of her three children.

For years she lived a life of drugs and alcohol, and at one point went to jail for six months. After 15 years, Wynette made the decision to go to Haven of Rest's Harvest Home, joined Alcoholics Anonymous and participated in an intensive outpatient program at the former Community Drug Board, now called the Community Health Center Addiction Services. She eventually was able to work part-time at a nursing home serving dinner, and also became an intern at the Mission. Being the first female resident intern, she felt privileged to help develop the program. After completing her internship, she began working at the Mission.

Wynette contracted Sarcoidosis Lung Disease in 1998. With Eileen's help, she received three one-hour treatments three times a week at an Infusion Center. Wynette stated, "The Lord and the staff, especially Eileen, Leah Gibson, Kim Swartz, and Kathleen Turner helped me to faithfully address my challenges,"

For over 24 years, Wynette has worked as a Supervisor at the Harvest

Home and lived on her own. She happily shares, *"They helped me find a house in 1997 and I still live in it.* "Wynette has reunited with her children. She has survived breast cancer, two strokes, and two brain surgeries. Due to illness, she no longer works at the Mission, but plans to volunteer when things get better. Wynette shares how she is active with her faith and enjoys attending Akron Bible Church.

Wynette thanks everyone for their support and kindly asks that we pray for her health, family, and the health of others during the pandemic.
