Although raised by good parents who worked hard to provide for him and his two sisters, David was unable to keep the temptations of the world from getting the best of him.

"Towards my Senior year, I started to make poor choices and hung out with a bunch of friends who smoked pot and drank," he says. At age 18, David moved in with his cousin, found a job,

and went to college to become a

Pharmaceutical Technician.

However, his habit of going to
bars gradually increased from
several times a month to multiple
times a week. He dropped out of
school and continued working in a
factory as a machine operator.



Over the years, his incessant focus on drugs and alcohol led him to lose his job in 2012. By 2015, he burned all the bridges with family and friends as he spiraled into the black abyss of his addictions. He found himself on the streets, bouncing from house to house before suddenly finding himself in jail. He called his mom, hoping she would come to get him. She said she couldn't help him this time and would only pick him up if he agreed to go to Haven of Rest. He did.

He stayed at the Mission from late 2015 to 2017, receiving help, working, and saved money before finding a place to live. However, he did not continue to grow or seek ongoing support from the community, church, family, and friends. After a while, he found himself slowly

relapsing.

Several years later, David recognized what was happening to him and knew he had to go back to Haven of Rest. "I knew it was a safe place where people had my best interests in mind and did not hesitate to call out my problem areas," he says. He talked to his boss and landlord, explaining to them what he needed to do. So early in 2020, he quit his job and moved out of his house to come to the Mission. He said he did not know of another place to go to where they had all the help at his fingertips to heal. He was determined to apply himself much more this time.

Today, David shares, "I have completed all the classes and learned a lot from them. The program I most benefitted from was my internship in the Facilities Department. The fellowship and guidance of the men in that department helped me focus on my strengths and pursue a more Biblical way of looking at life and work."

David shared that the Men's Evening Supervisor Luis McLat, Chaplain Jason Hubbard, and Facilities Manager Jeff Hyatt, along with other men on staff, have been a huge influence in his life and his walk with Christ.

Jim Cole, Director of Operations says, "The transformation in Dave's life has been amazing. It has been a true joy to walk with Dave as he allowed the Lord to change him from the inside out. He is a very different man than the one who first came to Haven of Rest. We are very excited about the man he is becoming and everything God has in store for him."

"Every day has its challenges, but I trust that God has a plan for me. I have to let Him be a part of my daily living to have that plan come to fruition," shares David.

David has joined Grace Bible Church in Akron where he is forming healthy relationships with people. He says he would like to go back to school for Mechanical Engineering. His prayer request is for God's plans for his pathways to be made clear, his new job to be stable, and the ability to find good housing.
