ALICIA, Now Blessed and Better

Alicia was jobless, addicted to heroin, and in an abusive nine-year relationship when she first came to Harvest Home in 2016. She talked about how she became pregnant at age 32 and had to take medication

for morning sickness which did more harm than good. Her son was born with a physical disability which changed the course of her life. The weight of caring for her son and juggling her schedule for his multiple surgeries, many doctor appointments, her job, and trying to care for herself became overwhelming.

"We were living in a van, my boyfriend and I. He beat another woman at the time and went to jail. I knew then that was my out."

Medication given to her after her C-section led her to using drugs more and more to cope with her pain and she became addicted. Concerned about her ability to care for her son, she asked her aunt to take care of him when he was three years old. Soon after that she met her boyfriend. Unfortunately, it would take many years before she was free of her addiction and this bad relationship.

"To cope with the pain, I went from pills to the pain killers to the heroin my boyfriend introduced me to."

When she finally came to the Mission, she was overwhelmed at first, and remembers being on the deck outside of the Safe Harbor area where she stayed with four other women. She felt very scared as she

looked at the sky. However, she found freedom and healing as she worked through her difficulties with the help of the Lord and supportive staff. At one point during her stay, a childhood friend had to help her hide from her ex-boyfriend when he was released from jail and came looking for her. She is happy to say that her childhood friend is now her fiancé.
