Nothing could hinder Wynette's devotion to serving. Even when she had found herself face to face with terrifying health challenges over the years — sarcoidosis, breast cancer, two strokes, a hip repair, and two brain surgeries — she not once asked, "Why me?" Instead, she repeatedly asked every doctor when she could go back to work.

Through all her years of struggle, Wynette ministered to others experiencing brokenness. From loss . . . to addiction . . . to diagnoses after diagnoses. She had known what it felt like to reach hope on the other side of herdship and hopelessness

Built in 1979, the Harvest Home is a safe place where women in crisis can find refuge and recovery. Your giving provides Christ-centered care that walks single women and mothers through distressing life circumstances.

Restoration starts with meeting physical needs. Guests receive access to shelter, clothing, hot showers, healthy meals, and more. It's amazing how much security three meals a day and a bed to sleep in can give. Your support makes sure the women have everything they need to feel safe so they can focus on the opportunity of a fresh start.

Every guest at Harvest Home receives emotional and spiritual care. The women can meet privately with a counselor, social services agent, or staff member to work through challenges or needs. There are daily opportunities to attend Bible studies and regular chapel services where women can gather together to worship and be discipled.

### YOU EMPOWER WOMEN TO LIVE WITH PURPOSE

With your generosity, we've been able to make sure mothers get the resources they need to be the caring parent God created them to be. The Nurture Center equips struggling moms with everything they need to look after their children. The women attend nutrition and parenting classes, meet with a case worker, interview for jobs, and so much more.
