"God did for me what I could not do for myself."

Taranta grew up in a tough environment, surrounded by bad influences and making poor choices. As a result, he fell into a cycle of substance abuse and crime.

"There was a void I was trying to fill, an emptiness," he said. "I was self-medicating to fill that void, but these were temporary fixes."

In 2007, Taranta came to Haven of Rest for the first time.

"It was a short stay because I wasn't ready to make a change," he said. "But a seed was planted."

Taranta soon returned to the streets and his destructive habits. "God was still there tugging at me," he said. "But I was ignoring it."

His turning point came when he ended up back in jail.

"There was someone in the cell beside me, a foul-mouthed,

Psalm 23 ("The Lord is my shepherd") became his guiding light.

"When you have a child and you hold your finger out, they take your hand in such a way that shows they trust you," he said. "They don't ask where you are taking them, they just follow. God showed me to trust Him in that same way—to follow Him.

"I want to be the father God intends for me to be," he said. "I want to have the light of Christ in me that others would see the love of Christ."

Men's Garden Project

Amazing things are growing at Haven of Rest!

While you may not be familiar with it, our Resident Men's Gardening Program has been harvesting vegetables, flowers, and hope since 1997.



Originally funded by a grant through the Ohio State University Extension program, the Men's Garden is an annual project that provides participants in our Conquerors Recovery Program with the unique opportunity to learn gardening skills. They also find some unexpected benefits as they participate in the program, which serves as an outlet

for men who are struggling with a variety of things as they come into the Mission. They are reminded of their capability to learn new things. They are given the chance to practice important life skills such as teamwork, creativity, planning, and follow-through. They are given the opportunity, perhaps for the first time, to understand the value of nurturing something. They build community as they work together to build a garden.

Indoor classes begin in March, supported by master gardener volunteers and special speakers who share knowledge on specific topics. In June, classes move to the "outdoor classroom" as the men plant, maintain, and later harvest their garden. Last year, more than 1,250 pounds of fresh produce was harvested and used by the kitchen in preparing meals for our guests.

"I didn't realize this would be about so much more than just planting flowers and vegetables," said John, a previous graduate of the program. "What I've learned is that relationship is the key to anything we want to grow, whether it be a garden, or even our lives."

Hope is being harvested at Haven of Rest — one vegetable at a time!


